



Digital Passenger Declaration (DPD)

Complete a DPD before travelling to Australia

It is an Australian Government requirement that all passengers arriving by air complete a Digital Passenger Declaration (DPD). The DPD collects critical health information which helps the Australian Government manage the safe arrival of passengers into the country. You must be able to provide evidence that this critical information was completed before boarding the aircraft.

Passengers must complete a DPD in full prior to check-in. Passengers who do not complete a DPD will be referred to Australian Border Force Officers on arrival in Australia and may face unnecessary delays.

You are strongly encouraged to complete your DPD in full, including the health section, before checking in for your flight. This will help to avoid delays when you arrive in Australia.

How do I complete a DPD?

The DPD can be completed by downloading the free mobile app from the [App Store \(Apple\)](#) or [Google Play store \(Android\)](#), or via the [web form](#).

You will need to create an account, which will allow you to manage your current and future declarations in one place. If you have multiple flights, you should list only your first flight and the flight that lands in Australia. Any transit stops on your way to Australia should be included in your declaration of your 14-day travel history.

Each passenger is required to complete a DPD. Parents or guardians should complete a declaration for any child under 16 years of age. Anyone who is 16 years old or over should complete their own declaration.

What do I do when I arrive at the airport?

Passengers should ensure they have completed a DPD prior to check-in at the airport. **You must show airline staff at check-in that you have completed the DPD in full** via the summary screen (either hard copy or electronic) and provide your supporting documentation as evidence. You must retain this documentation to present to Australia Border Force Officers on arrival in Australia.
